HONOR THE DREAM OF
40 YEARS AFTER HIS DEATH

AMERICA'S GREATEST CIVIL RIGHTS CHAMPION GAVE HIS LIFE SUPPORTING STRIKING SANITATION WORKERS seeking recognition for their union, AFSCME Local 1733, in Memphis, Tenn. There, on April 4, 1968, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated while preparing to march with union members.

How can we best honor Dr. King 40 years after he died defending the right of sanitation workers to have union protections?

We can defend San Diego sanitation workers—many of them African-Americans—battling for the same union protections Dr. King defended four decades ago! Mayor Jerry Sanders' proposal threatens to fire city unionized sanitation workers and turn their jobs over to non-union corporations.
